

## *THE PATRICK QUINN & MARY O'HALLORAN STORY*

**P**ATRICK QUINN was born about 1794 in County Clare in Ireland  
Patrick became generally known as "Pat"

**M**ARY O'HALLORAN was born about 1802 in Omesagh Beg, Quin in County Clare in  
Ireland to Michael O'Halloran and Mr Unknown

*Patrick Quinn and Mary O'Halloran farmed in Carrownalegan (Cappa), just over one mile from  
Sigmolebridge area in County Clare, Ireland*

*Sigmolebridge Parish records begin in 1828 so it follows that if Patrick and Mary were born and  
baptised in the area their baptism records have not survived*

**1830** - Patrick Quinn married Mary O'Halloran on 29<sup>th</sup> February 1830 in the Parish of Quin near  
Newmarket-on-Fergus, County Clare in Ireland

<p>The Griffith Valuation Record of 1837 also lists Patrick, Quin leasing a house, offices (sheds), a forge and land in Carrumaleague. The land area amounted to 3 acres 1 rood 13 perches. He was shown as sharing this with Michael. Patrick's share of the land was valued at £2. While the house, offices (sheds) and forge were valued at £1.5 shillings. This brought his total property valuation to £3.5 shillings.</p>	
<p>In the Land Records, Patrick is shown sub leasing a house and garden to Jane Quin. The area of the garden amounted to 1 rood 25 perches and was valued at 6 shillings. The house was valued at 9 shillings.</p>	
<p>He is also shown as leasing a house and garden to John Quin. The area of the garden amounted to 1 rood 25 perches and was valued at 6 shillings. The house was valued at 9 shillings.</p>	
<p>In Cappagh Lodge (the next neighbouring town land) Patrick, Quin leased 18 acres 1 rood 7 perches valued at £17. He was shown as leasing these from Revs. of Edward Knight Turner (in Chancery). In the town land of Cappagh River Patrick, Quin was shown as leasing a lordman's house and land. The land area was in 2 lots comprising 16 acres 2 roods 18 perches which was valued at £3 and 46 acres 17 perches which was valued at £74.13 shillings. This brought this section of his property to £98. He was leasing the property from John St John Smith (In Chancery).</p>

The death took place on Saturday, October 26, at her home in Newmarket-on-Fergus, of Mrs. Emily McGrath, an old and respected business woman in the area for many years.

The late Mrs. McGrath was a lady of charming qualities, whose serene disposition endeared her to all who had the privilege of her friendship.

Relict of Peter McGrath, victualler, the late Mrs. McGrath was a widely known and popular figure in the area. Her kind and pleasing manner made her many friends and her passing was deeply regretted by her friends. The large attendance at the funeral of the remains on Sunday evening and the funeral on the following morning was ample testimony to the high esteem in which she was held.

The remains were received by Rev. D. Woods, C.C., at Newmarket-on-Fergus Church and he was also celebrant of the Solemn Requiem Mass on Monday morning. Deacon was Rev. P. Chase, C.C., while Sub-Deacon was Rev. T. Crawford, C.C. Master of Ceremonies was Rev. P. Ryan, C.C., Ennis. The chorists were Rev. K. After Mass the burial took place at Kilmacodagh cemetery.

The chief mourners were: Vincent (son); Sister Mary Philomena, Convent of Mercy, Ennis; Rose, Shirley and Charles (daughters); Patrick (brother); Sister Mary Francis, St. Paul, Minnesota (niece); Mrs. Mary McGrath (daughter-in-law), and Michael Burke and Maurice Poyton (nephews), together with aunts, nephews and grandchildren.
