- 21 William Blackney of Beckenhore, Co. Dublin v Marcus Wickambe of Dryname, same Co. re debt.
- 22 Edmond Boorke fitzWater of Castellingearty, co. Limerick. His father Water McRickerd Boorke was seised of Ballyvricken containing 2 parts of a pld., and deed, when premisses descended to Edmond who was seised thereof as also of Cahirley, Ballyhobynne, and Ballihey, containing 1½ plds, till Tirrelagh O Hein, David O Hein, Planne O Hein, Flahy McClanghy, Gullyduff McClanghy, Edmond McCahir and Donnell O B. () entered, 10 Sept. 1584, and disseised him.
- 23 Walter Bourke of Limerick prays exemption from Jury service.
- 24 Robarte Bowen of Ballyadams Queen's Co., gent., v William Shergolde re 7 debts of Thomas Bowen bro: of Robarte Bowen.
- 25 Margaret Brennan of Thomaston, Co. () v. Anastas Strong., re debt.
- 26 William Brereton, gt., v Richard Netterville and James Walsh re lands leased to William Brereton by the Lord Chancellor as Archbishop of Dublin in Clonmethan, etc. co. Dublin.

- 29 Patricke Browne of Dublin, alderman v Mathew Kenser re a house in Patrick Street.

- 31 Sir Robert Browne vicar of Kilmacowe, co. Kilkenny v. Thade Dowling, Chancellor of Loughlin re lands in Old Loughlin.
- 32 John Bryee of Dublin, merchant, v Robert Kent re debt.
- 33 The Portreeve Burgesses and commonalty of Athboy v Walter Scurlocke of the Frain, co. Meath re lands called the Moor of Athboy.
- 34 Piers Butler of the Anaghes, co. Kilkenny v Leonard Blanchfield of Ballenbolith and David Baron of Clone, same Co., his trustees to uses.
- 35 Pyers Butler of the Parke O Kare, Co. Wexford, esq. and Rich^d Forstall fitzPatrick of the same yeoman (his lessee) v Serveragh O Doran of the Chappell gent. re lands of Cloneroche, the Chaple, Ballymakis, Rahineduffe, Tomfarny, Ballyvonyn and Cowlannefarn, co. Wexford after 1590 (P.B. died 1599).

- 37 Thomas Cantwell of Ballymackedy, co. Tipperary, gent. Teige Meale O (Kenedy) of (Bally)loughcappull and his ancestors were seised of the castell, bawen, stonehouse and 7/8 of a pld. in Ballyloughcappull and died, when Donell O Kenedy his son and (others) brothers of Donell entered and were seised 'according the custom of gavelkind used time beyond the memory of man, among the mere Irish within the said county and as the sept. of the O Kenedies are. - 89 Sir Nicholas Deveroux of Balmagir, Co. Wexford, knight v Richard Whittie & ors. (his trustees) seeking to raise a jointure for his wife on lands settled by his father.
- 90 Sir James Dillon of Moymet, knt. He was seised by L.P. of Q. Elizabeth, deceased, dated 20 Sept. 28^o, of 80^z arr. : 60^a past.: 120^a bog and 10^a wood in Corbally in O Magheris country and of the tithes of other parcels^{ls} belonging to Inqhenebeo, which are detained contrary to right by Shane Oge O Maghery of Corbally. The said O Magheries country is not shire ground. ("It was in the liberty of Tipperary").
- 91 Edulffe Dinglie, gent. v Patrick Dowdall of Drogheda after 27^o Eliz. re houses in Drogheda.
- 92 Andrew Donallan, vicar of Dromine (Limerick dioc.) v Abraham Corbet re tieths.
- 93 Marcus Dormer of () merchant v Thos. Shee of Kilkenny, merchant, after 1586 re debt.
- 94 James Dowdall of Lobenstown, co. Meath v George Stokes of Knockengen, same co. re title deeds detained.
- 95 Lawrence Dowdall of Clonymyne, co. Kildare v William Talbott of Kilmanaghe, co. Dublin, re debt.

- 96 Richard Dowdinge of Drogheda, merchant v Richard Dowdall re houses in Drogheda.
- 97 George Duff of Drogheda v Evan and Roger Williams re tithes of Terfeghin, co. Louth (after 1603).
- 98 Gerrotte, Earle of Kildare and Edmond Nugent of Dublin v Christopher Nugent of Moirath, gent. re fishing of River of Lavour and lough of Lough Woill, co. Westmeath, after 1602.
- 99 Grany ny Elem v Maurice Hicky and James Waale of Rathmore, co. Kildare, re debt.
- 100 Alsonne Eastace of Edwardstowne widow (exr. of George Sherlocke of Kildare deceased) v Thomas Ouldfilde, after 1574 re debt.
- 101 Christopher Everard of Moywary, co. Clare v William Duff of Dublin, butcher, re debt.
- 102 Richd. Fagan of Dublin, alderman v Humfry Forth of the same, gent. between 27^o Eliz. and 1603 re houses in Dublin.
- 103 Isabel Fallowes, adm. of Robt. Fallowes deceased v John Roch of Dublin 'Sayler' re merchandise shipped to England.
- 104 Mawrish, Ld. Viscount Fermoy. He and those whose title he has were seised of Ballynynahallaske, Ballynanelanagh, Lysnegurynagh and Rathefunshone, until he was wrongfully disseised by John O Kealagher, Edward Roche and William Roche of Carryckdownane, co. Cork, who entered thereon.

Redmond Purcell of Gragray co. Kilkenny, gent. re a debt due by Ellane Grace (mother of Redmond Purcell) deceased to Richd. late Viscount M. deceased.

- 222 Brien mcGarrahy of Dublin, mason. His grandfather, Murtagh mcDermody mcMahowny, of Corkickmore, gent. was seised of 1 pld. called Ballybegge () half a pld. called Garranywaddry, half a pld. called the Goyle, half a pld. called Garranymucky, all in the Barony of Coshmay, co. Limerick, and died, when the same descended to Diermode mcMortaghe as his son and heir, who died s.p., after which the premises descended, as of right it ought, to Honorary^{mc}Mortaghe, suppliant's mother, before whose entry, however, the rebellion of James fitzMorrice breaking out, the said Honora and suppliant (then of tender years) abandoned their inheritance and sought safety in the city of Dublin when said H nora died, when suppliant entered and was seised till expelled by Brien Duffe O'Brien of Carrigagenell, co. Limk. gent., Mahown O'Brien of the same and Donell mcMahowne Meriegh of the same.

- 223 William mcMahown of Ballinvoly in Upper Ossory, gent. and Knogher O Dowlin of Kilclonfert in Upper Ossory, husbandman, tenants to Florence Lord Baron of Upper Ossory. Teig Keogh O Carroll fitzTeig, gent. Edmond O Karroll otherwise named Edmond Mell, Kernagh, Dorrell Grome mcWilliam O Karroll, horseman, Cormock Inocush, Galloglas, Shane mcWilliam Ley, Kernagh, Shane mcWilliam Owre, Kernagh, Murrogh beg O Banan, Stokagh, Teig Riegh O Banan, Stokagh, and divers others to the number of 20, all servants and retained men to Sir Charles O Carroll, knt. by command of the said Sir Charles, come

to Ballinrally in Upper Ossory, the 16 of this instant Nov. 36^o Eliz. (1593) and carried off 18 mares, each worth 40/2, suppliant's goods and drove them into the woods of Glascearr in Ely, and there do wrongfully detain them.

- 224 John McCallaglin of Ballinrowan, co. Limerick, husbandman v Sir Henry Uttred of Meane, co. Limerick re land demised to J.M's father by Sir Henry Uttred.
- 225 Thomas McNeboe of Kyllaghe, gent. He was seised of a castle, a hall, 40 messuages and 60 acres land, with meadow, pasture and wood, 6 fishing 'warres' in Cryvagh beg in Co. Longford, till Onory O Ferall of Ceryveaghe beg, widow, Holbarte O Ferall and Gerald O Ferall of the same, gent. wrongfully disseised him.
- 226 Shane mcNemara Fin, Chief of this name (William Neyland) of Knockugan, Co. Clare, gent. came to Kilbreackan and wrongfully took away 5 ricks of oats and barley, and likewise took away from suppliant's towns of ()urry, Crattellagh, and Rathnellan, 4 worth 30/2 each and 50 sheep (damaged) (Shane Neyland also mentioned).
- 227 Edmond mcMorieragh mcGilpatrick and Teig mcOwen mcGilpatrick. They and their ancestors were seised of the one moiety of Ballenesragh and Killinearyn in the territory of Kinshallaghs, in the co. of Wexford, one Grany nyne Edmond Rwoe, widow (in 1605) and now wife to Diermod mcEnerreth of Gorthanane in the Kinshallaghs, the said Diermod and Patrick Esmond, gent. suppliant's in their possession by distraining their cattle. After October, 1608.
- 228 Denyse mcRorye of Dondrome, merchant v William Cartan

- 280 Cornell Rony of Mullagare, Co. Westmeath, merchant v. Francis Hamone of the same, merchant, after 1581, before 1603. Re debt.
- 281 Thomas Rochford of Wexford, merchant v Jowane Codd of Wexford, widow and others. Re a house in Wexford.
- 282 Christopher Russell of Waspelston, co. Downe, gent. He was seised, inter alia of 12^a Great measure in Newport of Rathmolan, and of the 3rd part of 12 huses there, co. Downe, and was wrongfully disseised by George Russell of Rathmolen, gent.
- 283 John Russell, Parson of Moylesker, co. Westmeath v. Morish Hamon of Mollinga, gent. re the Rectory of Moylesker.
- 284 Mathew Russell of Rish, gent. v Nycholas Sweeteman of the same, re lands in Rish (Rush, co. Dublin) demised to Mathew Russell by the Earl of Ormond.
- 285 Derby Ryane of Solloghod, co. Tipperary v Donill mcFerrill, vicar of Salloghod and Terrellaghe backagh McCraegh of Tipperary re tithes of Solloghod, demised by Donill mcFerrill to Derby Ryane. (D.R. died 1563)
- 286 Walter Ryan of Dublin, servant of James Ryan a clerk in Chancery v Henry Seis of Kilkenny, merchant and Rosse Savadge of the same widow re houses in Kilkenny.
- 287 James Rysim of Dublin, gent. v Margaret Dongan a.l. Walter Dongan (widow and son of John Dongan) re lands called Kilmacargin near Donbrook, in the liberty of Dublin.

- 288 Thomas Sarsfield of Cork, Gent. v Fynen McDonnoghie
alias McFynen of () v. Desmond D. Kyery, gent.
and Teig O Hwollighan late of the Palice in said co.
gent. After 1553. Re debt.
- 289 () of Kinsale, co. Cork v. Thomas
Sarsfield of Cork and James Weashe re a mortgage of
the lands of Castellnyparkye alias Castlepark near
Kinsale temp. Elizabeth.
- 290 John Scurlocke of Wexford v. Patrick Lampert of the
same, tailor re a house in Wexford.
- 291 Richard Scurlock of Dirawen, co. Clare, gent. He was
seised these 7 years past of the Rectory of Dromcreif
and Kilvally, alias Ogormicke, by demise from William
O Costely, parson of the same. Now one Donagh McSwyne of
Tramro and Dermot O Herry have obtained, by false
information, the administration thereof from the
Prerogative Court dated 3 Nov. 1663. made 1062 conf. error
- 292 John Sellenger v John Egerton, vicar of Stabanan and
Patrick Dromgoole gent re tithes of Stalanen parish.
- 293 George Sexten (s & h. of Syman Sexten of Limerick
deceased) v Thomas Younge of the same, alderman re
houses in Limerick.
- 294 Joane and Ellene Sherlock of () widow v. Nicholas
Ley and George Walshe of Waterford re goods of Margeret
Lombard, their mother, deceased.
- 295 James Shortall of Ballaloran, co. Kilkenny, Gent. v
James Shortall fitzPers of Burdesheis, gent. re debt.
