- 43 Sir Richard Barnewall of Kirkestone, co. Meath, Baronet v Robert Lile of Trim^{meath} re lands of New Castell, Johnston and Poseckstone, ^{co. Meath} leased to Robert Lile (fragment).
- 44 Richard Barnewall of Crickstone, esqr. and others v. Nicholas Wickombe of Dublin, gent., re lands of Sturmynstowne, co. Dublin.
- 45 Nicholas Browne of Waterford, merchant v Elinor Creaghe and Peter Creagh fitzVincent and James Creagh fitzAndrew of Limerick, after 1624, re conversion of goods (?).
- 46 Robert Lord Digby of Geshill and Richd. Burrowers, Esq^r. v Edward Blount and ors. re lands of Kilbride ^{Baron}

- 49 Robert Conwaye, D.L., a ^{Master} in Chancery v Richard Sedgrave of Rathgarre, co. Dublin re lands in Rathgarre, leased by Richard Sedgrave dated 1600. 1600 x 1605

- 50 Thomas Colclough (son and heir of Sir Anthony) v. Williams Thomas/of Tinterne esq. and Dame Clare his wife, re lands of Ballyboughe, Pillington, the Grange of Kilmora etc. ^{of a house in New Ross}
- 51 Boetius Clancy of Chockfinne, co. Clare, gent. and Onery ny Mahoune widow of Boetius Clancy the elder, exrs. of the will of said Boetius the elder v William Neillane of Dromerihy, Donough O Loughlen of Ballyenfynde and Conon Waghery of Kearukeill in said co. gents re debt.
- 52 Nicholas Chivers of Gewardstone, co. Meath, Margaret Dowdall his wife and others v Alson Barnewall of Stamene, co. Meath, widow re lands of Donakerny, co. Dublin.
- 53 John Churchowse gent v John Weedon of Dublin and Robt. Brandshawe of the same, Pewterer. re debt. After 1594.
- 54 Michell Chamberlin of Dublin, alderman v Patrick Ardeghe of the same Haberdasher re debt.

- 105 Edward Dowdall of Athboy v Sir Thomas FitzWilliams of Meryong, after 1602, re debt.
- 106 Loughlin Daly v. Ferall mcf) of () co. Wexford.
Re a marriage arranged, 1604, between said Loughlin Daly and Margaret Meghe (or Beghe) daughter of said Ferall. (faded).
- 107 James Dowdall of the Carricke, gent. He was seised of a castle and lands in Glaspistle, and other lands, co. Louth (of lands in Brownstown, co. Louth, till disseised by Laurence reputed son of John Dowdall, (whose mother is daughter of Sir Thomas Casack and his wife daughter of Plunkett of Bewley.
- 108 Sir Stephen Butler of Belturbet v Marion Montgomery, re lands settled.
- 109 Roger Dillon of Baledromny, co. Meath, gent. v Laurence Taffe of Ardmolchene, co. Meath, gent, re debt.
- 110 Thomas Delahide of Drogheda, alderman and Peirs Nugent of the same, alderman v Gerrald O Connor of Donlere, co. Louth, gent., after 1583, re debt for wine.
- 111 Francis Dawes of Caffly, Shropshire and Richard Rae of Bridgnorth in the said Co. v. Daniell O'Brien of Carrowduff, co. Clare, Donnagh O'Brien, John Conyne and Laughline Oge O'Hara, the said Daniell was seised of the Castle town and lands of Carrowduff, and by his lease of July 1637, demised to orators, their exrs. and as., all the Castle, town and lands of Carrowduff, containing 2 qrs. or 2 plds., vizt. the quarter myer or cartron belonging to the said castle, the quarter myer or cartron commonly called Knocknaboniffe, the ha. gr.

- of Derrileigh, the cartron or carrowmyre of Killnoe the half quarter or half poughland of Magherie and Bobollog, and the cartron of Craigneboye and Knockardonish, all in the parish of Meth and barony of Insequine, co. Clare, to hold for 31 years paying for the first three years, £120, at the perfection of the lease, and for the 4th year, £26:15:4d., and thereafter £40 per annum. Now the said Daniell, Donnagh, John and Laughline oge trouble and annoy Francis Dawes and Richard Rae in their possession, (lengthy with many details of outrages and annoyances against Francis Dawes and Richard Rae).
- 112 John Davis of Croghan, co. Clare, gent. and Anye his wife, (daughter of John Gaydon late of Dublin, alderman deceased, v Nicholas Gaydon (son and heir of said John Gaydon)) and Nicholas Quoytrode, re dowry of Anye unpaid.
- 113 James Dowdall of Rathowth, co. Meath v Patricke Faulffe of Fydorffe, co. Meath, gent, re ? (very fragile).
- 114 Ellin Duffe, Paule, Simon, and James Duffe, children of James Duffe of () co. Wexford, gent. deceased v. Alexander Leonard, Edward Roth and ors., Feoffees to trust of said James Duffe, the elder.
- 115 Phillip Deveroux of Ballimager, co. Wexforde, esq. v. Oliver Keating of Kilcowan and the Lady Ellen Deveroux his wife, re the chattels and debts of James Deveroux of Ballimagir, deceased father of Phillip Deveroux.

- 214 Patrick Moore of Spreclenton, co. Dublin, farmer v. Robert FitzRery. After 1588. Re lands of Spreclenton and Gellanston, co. Dublin, devised by John FitzRery of Collostragh, brother of Robt.
- 215 Michell, Thomas, Andrew and John Moore v. Robert Chevers. Re estate of Lawrence Moore of Drogheda, father of Michell, etc. deceased (badly damaged).
- 216 Edmund Moleyan of the Haven, co. Meath v. John and Robert Begg, re a partnership in Trade. (damaged).
- 217 John Marshall, late sheriff of Dublin v. John Boddie of Athlone, gent. Re proceedings relative to the arrest of James Dillon at the suit of John Boddie.
- 218 Nicholas Madden of Waterford, gent. v. Robert Browne of the same, merchant. Re lands of Lisnackille, co. Waterford, Robt. Browne's interest being by grant from Lord Power and Nicholas Madden's by lease from Nicholas Power of Kilsadan, gent.
- 219 Rice Morgan of Dublin, gent. v. (). Re a previous suit brought by him against Thomas Popper of Glasarrick, esqr. (details of Popper's family) (damaged).
- 220 Edward May of Dublin, gent. v. Martagh O'Donnell (who detains rents he was employed to collect Londonderry and Tyrone), Philleary O'Kneher of Tullynis, co. Armagh and others (a fragment of 17th century).

- 221 Morgan Marshall of Harwestowne, co. Dublin, yeoman and Elizabeth Germaine his wife v. John Harteene (of Drogheda), Joiner. Re goods detained.
- 222 Adam Moore of Drogheda, sadderman v. (). After 1621 mentions John Stanley. Re debt. (a fragment only).
- 223 Sir Robert McClelland, knight v. the Company of Clothworkers, London. Re lands in co. Londonderry, devised to Robert McClelland. (damaged).
- 224 Brian McCoghegan, Conc McCoghegan, Art McCoghegan, Conc McCoghegan and Hugh McCoghegan, gent., v. Neil McCoghegan, James McCoghegan, Richard McCoghegan, Edward McCoghegan, Owen McCoghegan, Katherine McCoghegan, William McCoghegan, Elinor his wife and John FitzPatrick and Gideon his wife adms. of Rosse McCoghegan, deceased who are indebted to suppliants in £1000, ster : by reason of a bond or obligation entered into by said Rosse, dated 6 Jan. 1574.
- 225 Doncho McDermott, alias McDyllegheddy of Fearinagh, co. Kerry, gent. one Conchar McTeig McDoncho of Killybegh, Bernade oge of Callcloghyr, Fynnen McDonyll of the same, Shan Sallaghe of Killykrolaght, Teig of Gortlanefearne, Conchar McTeig McFynnen of the same Donyll McShaine of Reantennane Conchar McShain McConchoy of Callmory, Kery McShain McConchoy of the same, Phel O'Schel of Killyleighterquo, Conchar Anna, ghter of Concan and Conchar Curragh of the same in said co. do wrongfully and unjustly detain from suppliant co. rents and duties whereof suppliants predecessors have ever time out of mind quietly and peaceably possessed

226 Hubbert mCmoriertaghe and Shean mCmoriertaghe of Lysvickavra, co. Westmeath, yeoman. Their father Bryane mCmoriertaghe, lately deceased, was seised of a quarter and half a quarter of land called Liswickarra alias Aghengarrowe in the Barony of Moygwoise, co. Westmeath, and died so seised, 'by force whereof, and the custom in the said Barony tyme beyond man's memory used and allways allowed, specially in the lands aforesaid, that the lands therein should descend unto all the sons of any man dying seised thereof, the said qr. and half qr. descended and ought to descend unto William mCmoriertaghe and the suppliants his brethren and coheirs unto the said Bryan according to the said custom. Nevertheless the said William hath entered into the whole and keeps the possession thereof, refusing suppliant's request for a partition.

227 Neill mGoghegan, James mGoghegan, Richd. mGoghegan, Edward mGoghegan, Owen mGoghegan, John fitzPatrick, Giles his wife, William Brymingham, Elliner his wife and Katherin ny Goghegan adms. of Rosse mGoghegan deceased v. Brian mGoghegan, Con mGoghegan, Arthure mGoghegan, Conly mGoghegan and Hugh mGoghegan of Downavern, co. Westmeath, gents are indebted to suppliants in 1000£ sterling, by reason that the said Brien, Arthure Conly and Hugh by bond dated 6 Jan. 1574 hand themselves in that sum to the said Rosse, after whose death John Gavy Archdeacon of Meath committed the administration of his goods to suppliant, by letters dated 27 Sept. 1580.

228 Donnogh mCinerrynein of Carrigauran, gent. His father, Laughlin mCinerry, was seised of Ballikillie, Ballisallaghbegg, Leaghkearrowegteragh, containing 4 qrs. of land and two mills in the co. of Clare and Barony of Bunratty and enjoyed the same peaceably till he was murdered by Mahoune mCinerry of Knockslotterie and Melmorry mCEdmonde, Galliglass, brother-in-law to the said Mahoune, on the 1st February 1573, Orator being then of the age of 5 years or thereabouts. The premises descended to Orator as son and heir to his father, but Mahoune mCinerryne has ever since unjustly withheld them.

229 Ough mKeogh of Derrleha, Donagh mKeogh of Reakele, Brian Magline (and Shane) O Kereghan of the Moote in the co. of Galway, gents., their fathers, G. f. sson and other ancestors were seised without claim or disturbance of any persons of certain lands viz: Colla mKeogh father to the said Ough was seised of his ancient inheritance of the town and lands of D(erle)ha consisting of 2 qrs., which descended to the said Ough 40 years past, who is still holding the same quietly: Colla mKeogh father to the said (Donagh) was seised of the town of Reakeale, being 2 qrs. which descended to the said Donagh and to Shan mKeogh 30 years past 'by course of the custom law of gavelkind nature in the co. of Mannagh time out of mind used', by force whereof they always since held the said town: Flan Magline father to the said Brien was seised in coparcenary of the moitie of the town and lands of Keappeagh with others his coparceners of the Maglines by the

aforesaid, which descended to the said Brian his son and heir, who held it in severally by reason of a partition made 40 years past. Loughlin O Kereghan father to the said Shan O Kereghan was seised of the town of the Moote and the lands known by the names of Lecaerue in Moote and Lecaruegarie Moare as his ancient inheritance, which descended to the said Shane as his son and heir, who holdeth the same this 30 years in quiet possession, till of late Henry Bingham esqr. often vexed complainants by procuring sundry processes against them out of the Presidency Court of Connaght and out of this court to the end to make them forsake their said freeholds' and inheritances. And in like manner this last assises in the said County Sir Thomas Roger on behalf of the Earl of Ormond, under whom he holds the town of Aughrim, alleging that their suppliant's towne were the ancient inheritance of the said Earl, obtained an order that the said Earl should be established in the said lands.

- 230 William McKeady of Killonane, co. Limerick, yeoman. He was seised of one ploughland called Ballycahane in co. Tipperary, one half ploughland called Glanville in said Co., one half ploughland called Downan in said Co., one ploughland called Curraghduffe in said Co., until, 13 April 1605. ^{McEdmond} Henrie McGrath of Curraghduffe co. Tipperary, yeoman, Teige McDonagh of Kyally and William McMourough O Kyallye wrongfully disseised him.

- 231 Conner McDonagh of Ballindoune, co. Sligo, gent. and Una ny Royrke alias Dogherty alias ny Donagh his wife v. Sir Cahaire O Dogherty, knt. for the dower of fee said Una of the Manor of Ellagh and other lands in the country of Inishoyne, co. Downegall, of which Sir John O Dogherty, knt. her late husband was seised.
- 232 Ferall McCahill, vicar of the Sraide, co. Westmeath v. Walter McTibbott, who distrained his cattle grazing, as was his right, on the commons of the toune of the Sraide.
- 233 Terrelagh McBrien late of Finis, co. Clare. He was seised of the castle, town and lands of Finis, containing 1 qr. or ploughland, until, 13 April 1606, one Donell McBriene of Insiveknaghlen, gent., wrongfully disseised him by force.
- 234 Donnell McFawny v. Sir Richard Traver, on behalf of Arture Bagnoll, esqr. re lands of Killohane, co. Down.
- 235 Peter Nangle of Busshoppston, co. (Westmeath ?). Donagh O Ferall of Glane was possessed of the () land of Crosse, co. Longford, by demer from P() McMahon, Bishop of Ardagh, which house the said Do(nagh) conveyed to suppliant was seised thereof until Lesagh O Ferall, Rich. O Ferall of Mastrome, Canock O Ferall of Crosse, Morragh McGylegyveny Oyne O Ferall and Mourgh O Ferall of the same, gents. wrongfully entered in the said 3 cartrons and disseised him.
