Donnogh, not being able to prove suppliants to be bastards, and being troubled was suppliants verily believe - with a remorse of conscience, about 14 years past, by articles indented and perfected, agreed that all the lands etc. then in their possession should be divided, and suppliants to have a 3rd part to them and their heirs, which division was made by one John Hynan and ors., in which division the said fishing wears and a great part of the arable lands were left undivided, of all of which the said Donnogh, since his father's death, has had the benefit and profit, and the said Donnogh has also entered into a great part of the arable land allotted in said division unto suppliants, and into the chief place of dwelling and diverse messuages which were also allotted to them, and debating the same, and the said Downagh O Madine, with Morogho McBrassall O Madine, Donell O Maddin, Melaghlín McGillechrist, Mlaghlín More, Dermott McCuolaghan, Donel O Dowlin, Teig McCouly, and Thomas O Leny, and many ors. the said Downaghs tenants and servants, disturb suppliants in possession of the lands allotted to them, by grazing on part thereof and stopping and unyoking their ploughs: And whereas by other indented articles under the hand and seal of the said Downagh, made about 14 years since, it was agreed between the said Downagh of the one part, and suppliants of the other part, that the parties should join together and equally contribute to the charges of recovering and getting into possession the 2 qrs. of Glaister, 2 qrs. of Ballineshra, and Fidane, the qr. of Bodelagh, the 3rd part of the qr. of Killtilasty,

called Killtylaisty and Terkillin, 2 qrs. of Leavally and Gleanedorke, the qr. of Camgort, the 2 qrs. of Oghelmore and the 5 cartrons, (be it more or less) of Lissyriaghan in Longford barony, co. Galway, being as they conceived their anceert inheritance, and being only directed by the said Downagh in following the suit, resolved first to commence suit against Hugh oge O Dalachan of Bodelagh esq. for the qr. of Bodelagh and the 2/3 of the qr. of Killtiloisty and Tirekellin, whereon they first joined in a lease and brought an action of ejection at common law, which suit the said Hugh removed to Chancery, from whence a trial was prescribed by leading order in the co. of Galway, which triall being pending, the said Downagh, contrary to the agreement, and to the reposed in him by suppliants who had left the whole management of the suit to him, entered into a compromise with the said Hugh (being his brother-in-law) unknown to suppliants, that the said Hugh should permit the said Downagh and his heirs to possess a parcell of Killtylasty, cont. half a cartron, in consideration whereof the said Downagh was to release the said action. And the said Downagh did also wrongfully compound with divers other persons who wrongfully withheld from suppliant the 2 qrs. of Ballineshra and Fidane.

Florence FitzPatrick of Lis(downeearny), co.  but (knowing the great trust the said Fynyn Mergagh
 had in Boetius Clanchy, in whose patent he passed his
 lands) he would deliver it to him personally on
 condition of redelivery). Upon the passing of the
 jointure, the said Boetius (by reason of the alliance
 of his wife Honora ny Mahon with the said Inyn Duffe
 ny Mahon was chosen feoffee along with Mortagh
 McMahon brother to Innyn Duffe, one Derby Nestor.
